You **MUST** have ground handling wheels as insurance does not allow for hovering into the space unless arrangements are made for you to be the first to arrive and the last to leave. We have a cart to tow aircraft. We also have the ability to park your aircraft in a place where you can launch on a moment's notice if you're on call. For our Code 3 Career Fair participants, we just need to know if you are on call and would need to leave in a hurry.

Thank you again for considering participating in our event this year. We strive to make this an event that both the public and participants enjoy.
